FOOTNOTES

1. Priority enrolment areas (PEA) have been defined in terms of official suburban boundaries and street names, as shown on the Maps of Canberra by Suburbs. Roads may be used as boundaries for Priority Enrolment Areas. In these instances the roadway is the boundary. Proposed new development areas such as in Gungahlin and in Dunlop have been included within the relevant priority enrolment areas to provide guidance for potential residents.
2. College students resident in Gungahlin have priority enrolment at Copland, Dickson or Lake Ginninderra Colleges.
3. Kambah students have priority enrolment at either Lake Tuggeranong or the Canberra College.
